

With a strong reputation for preparing young minds for life through supportive, inclusive and well-rounded education, South Australia produces students who are empowered to thrive academically, socially and personally.

Excel with extracurricular activities

South Australian schools offer a wide range of extracurricular activities and subjects, allowing students to explore their personal development while achieving academic success. These activities, including literacy and academic projects, artistic performances, ethical and inter-cultural understanding, contribute to a well-rounded education. Camps and excursions, in particular, give students a real Australian experience, allowing them to explore nature and learn about local culture, helping them

Safe and supported accommodation for school students

A variety of accommodation options are available to help students feel at home and supported during their studies.

Homestay

A homestay gives students the opportunity to live with a local family, offering cultural immersion, language practice, and meals in a safe, accredited environment. To ensure comfort and security, prospective homestay families undergo national police and background checks, in-home interviews and complete home inspections. Schools work with homestay providers to arrange the right match for students. It's a wonderful way to settle into your new home town, have an Australian experience, and make lifelong friends.

Boarding school

Some independent schools in Adelaide provide the option of on-campus accommodation for students through boarding houses. These facilities offer a structured setting that supports both academic and personal development. Students are supervised by dedicated staff and have access to meals, utilities and tailored academic assistance, alongside a variety of extracurricular activities. The boarding environment fosters independence while promoting social engagement in a diverse and multicultural community.

Nominated accommodation

You can nominate to live with a relative or family friend while studying.

A relative must be approved by the Department of Home Affairs,
a non-relative or family friend must be accredited as a nominated homestay.



Preparing young people to study, live and work successfully in a changing world

There are seven general capabilities that your child will gain at school in South Australia alongside their academic learning to prepare them for future success: critical and creative thinking, literacy, numeracy, information and communication technology capability, personal and social capability, ethical understanding and intercultural understanding.

Primary Education

South Australia's primary school system spans from Reception to Year 6, catering to students aged approximately 5-12 years of age. The curriculum covers a broad range of subjects, including English, mathematics, science, technology, health and physical education, the arts, and languages, providing students with a strong foundation for future learning. Primary schools offer an enriching experience, guided by highly qualified teachers who are dedicated to supporting both academic and personal development.

Secondary Education

South Australia's secondary school system begins at Year 7 and runs through to Year 12, serving students aged approximately 13-18 years. Students have the opportunity to combine university and Vocational Education and Training (VET) subjects with their high school studies, providing flexible pathways to further education and career opportunities.

Secondary schools in South Australia feature world-class facilities and industry-leading teachers, equipping students with the knowledge, problem-solving skills, critical thinking and confidence required to thrive in a rapidly changing world. South Australian Certificate of Education (SACE) (Years 11-12) is offered in all high schools in South Australia. Select schools also offer the International Baccalaureate (IB).

Globally recognised school curriculum

The South Australian Certificate of Education (SACE)

The South Australian Certificate of Education (SACE) is a modern, internationally recognised secondary school qualification designed to equip students with the skills, knowledge, and personal capabilities to prosper in our fast-paced global society. It provides pathways to employment and further education, giving students more flexibility to choose subjects that reflect their interests, talents, and career goals.

SACE subjects are made up of investigations, performances, and other assessment tasks to showcase unique personal abilities, and provide theoretical and practical, hands-on, action-based learning both inside and outside school. SACE students generally complete five subjects per semester, giving them time to develop their understanding of topics, grasp complex ideas, make connections between concepts, and apply their learning to real-world scenarios.

Upon completion of Year 12, students receive an Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) based on their academic results. The ATAR is recognised for entry into all Australian universities and Technical and Further Education (TAFE) institutions, along with many universities

International Baccalaureate

The International Baccalaureate Diploma Program (IBDP), typically completed during Years 11 and 12, offers a challenging and rigorous academic curriculum comprising six subjects, designed to develop students into global citizens. The IBDP is recognised by universities worldwide and is highly esteemed for admission to Australian and international higher education institutions. Students receive an IB Diploma score out of 45, which is also converted to an ATAR, providing a pathway to university entrance both in Australia and abroad.

Government and Independent Schools

South Australian schools run by the government or privately-owned independent schools are both internationally recognised for providing high-quality education from early learning and primary school through to secondary school. Parents may choose between them based on factors such as cost, educational approach, religious connection and the desire for specialised programs or extracurricular activities.

The additional year is available for graduates of South Australian institutions who have completed a higher education degree and maintained residence in South Australia as a holder of a first Temporary Graduate Work Visa (subclass 485). This benefit is not available to international students in Melbourne, Sydney and Brisbane.*

South Australia is internationally acclaimed for its quality food and wine, and associated world leading research and development programs¹. In 2022-23, South Australia's agriculture, food and wine industry supported more than 78,000 jobs³. South Australia is the home of world-famous wines brands such as Penfolds and Jacob's Creek, producing 50% of Australia's bottled wine and 80% of Australia's premium bottled wine.



Critical technologies

South Australia is globally recognised as one of the world's leading technology hubs. The thriving workforce that supports a diverse and connected ecosystem of business, researchers and investors drives economic growth². Global tech companies like Accenture, Microsoft and Tesla all have offices in Adelaide.



Health and medical

Adelaide's flagship health and medical precincts bring together world-class researchers, companies, government, education, infrastructure, and clinical care to create new opportunities for innovation. Adelaide BioMed City is the largest health and medical precinct in the Southern Hemisphere and is expanding with the addition of a new Women's and Children's Hospital, expected to be completed around 2030–2031. South Australia's health sector is expected to more than double to 5 billion by 2030⁴, creating vast job opportunities.



Creative industries

South Australia has helped create many cinematic blockbusters such as *Thor: Love and Thunder*, the *Harry Potter* series, *Game of Thrones* and *If Time Flows Back*. Adelaide Metro has frequent and reliable public transport services, including buses, trains and trams, and has among Australia's shortest wait times¹, so you'll spend less time waiting and more time doing the things you love. All tram routes within the CBD are free, and there's a free city connector bus which links many of the city's most popular places.

Full-time international students enjoy the same benefits as domestic students for public transport, and receive a 50% discount on a regular monthly metroCARD, offering unlimited travel during the month.

Cycling is also an affordable way to get around Adelaide, with bike paths and lanes throughout the city. A grid layout and compact design also makes Adelaide easy to walk around and explore.
